OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- Have you thought about managing the project and can show how you plan to deliver the results in the timeframe?
- Have you consulted with relevant stakeholders, such as the relevant land manager and can demonstrate their support?
- Have you considered working with other organisations to improve delivery of your project?
- Have you sought technical advice on 'best-practice' for your on-ground works?
- Have you considered whether there are any relevant existing, local or catchment natural resource management plans or other activities your project may align with?

Measuring your project's success

A good way of keeping your project on track that will also assist in monitoring and evaluating its success is to have performance measures.

Set your objectives – Work out what you're trying to achieve through this project? Success is measured against your project's objective(s). Each objective should have a way of showing if it is successful.

Collecting data – What is your starting point? Think carefully about what information you need to collect and how when planning your project. Is there existing data that can be used? What information can be collected during the project which will show if you are achieving your objectives? (i.e. before/after photos).

Set your measures of success.

What do you aim to have achieved by the end of the project? Are there points throughout implementation which will show progress towards the objective(s)?

Examples

- Number of plants propagated
- Number of species with seed collected
- Area of revegetation (ha)
- Length of coastline or waterway protected (km)
- Area protected by fencing (ha)
- Area of weed species treated
- Area of weeds controlled
- Number of plans developed or reviewed
- Number of field days or workshops held
- Number of people engaged through activities
- Number of sites monitored
- Number of threatened species protected
- Area of threatened species habitat managed
- Number of schools visited or involved
- Number of aboriginal heritage assessments
