GREEN ARMY EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FORM FOR VOLUNTEER GROUPS/LANDHOLDERS*

NRM South and Landcare Tasmania have joined forces to successfully recruit three Green Army teams coordinated by Conservation Volunteers Australia, to work on 3 project Teams from June-October 2015, February-July 2016, July-Dec 2016.

The NRM South/Landcare Tasmania project is focused on working with landholders(*who are already involved with Landcare Tasmania/NRM South with grant projects) and public land managers, community volunteers and NRM professionals to enhance and accelerate community work that protects and conserves NRM assets within Southern Tasmania, and will build on existing projects of Landcare Tasmania and NRM South into the region.

The type of activities that will be supported include those that:

1. Enhance and improve habitats in and around significant flora, fauna and place including Ramsar sites, and support commonwealth listed fauna, multiple vegetation types, including enhancement of significant flora and significant habitat- woodland communities
2. Improve aesthetic and diversity of urban landscapes in public areas improving habitat for significant species, and build on existing urban corridor projects
3. Conduct revegetation activities that will build on previously government invested projects, and create corridor linkages, habitat extension, and improve species diversity in degraded/cleared landscapes including river/coastal zones and farms.

This Green Army project will also seeks a diversity of locations, activities and experiences for the Green Army participants, so they can work with NRM professionals, volunteers and landholders and gain on-the-job experience about natural resource management initiatives and approaches across the region.

The Green Army is an Australian Government initiative supporting individuals aged 17-24 years to gain on ground experience caring for their local environment. The teams will comprise of 9 team members and 1 supervisor.

GREEN ARMY OVERVIEW

1. NRM South and Landcare Tasmania will attempt to support as many EOI's as possible over the 3 teams, and successful applications will be based on priority activities.
2. EOIs can be completed at any time, but generally are provided to applicants to Landcare Tasmania or NRM South grant programs
3. Green Army availability are limited to 2 on-site days per project, Mon-Thurs during each project period (Mon – Fri during Jun-Jul Winter period). A typical day is 6.5- 8-hour including breaks. Teams are generally up to 9 participants and a Supervisor
4. Limit to funding request to support project - generally applicants can seek up to \$1000 equivalent in funding for revegetation related materials only per Team, max \$3000 for groups accessing each Project Team. There are 3 project Teams from June-October 2015, February-July 2016, July-Dec 2016.
5. WHS and Induction requirements- All community/NRM Professionals/Volunteers must abide by on site safety plan when working alongside Green Army Team members and provide any onsite safety plans to the team Supervisor on induction.
6. Public land manager approval/support- All community members must have permission of the land managers that the Green Army Team will be involved in their project where projects are on public land.
7. Green Army Travel- Green Army Teams will generally not travel more than 1 hour each way from Hobart, please indicate in your EOI if travel time is more than 1 hour to your project site.
8. Wet weather may impact on agreed/proposed work activities and will be managed on a case by case basis. Days may be allocated to future teams if weather significantly impacts on project activity. Green Army Teams are generally not able to stay overnight on projects, but can be negotiated with CVA on a case by case basis.
9. Green Army Teams are equipped with a number of tools that can be used on site including planting tools, digging equipment, brush-cutters, spray equipment.
10. Green Army Team members are not professional contractors. They are not considered to be highly skilled and will be learning on the job as they go. They will gain experience working on your project and be not suitable for highly technical/advanced restoration activities, unless under specialist supervision. Please consider if the team is appropriate for your activity, and what the participants may learn on your site to build their own skills and experience in protecting the environment
