

Call for Expressions of Interest

Membership of the Steering Committee for the *Improving the ecological character of Moulting Lagoon and Apsley Marshes Ramsar sites* project

The *Improving the ecological character of Moulting Lagoon and Apsley Marshes Ramsar sites* project aims to protect and improve the ecological condition of Moulting Lagoon and Apsley Marshes Ramsar Sites. This will be achieved through on-ground activities including working with landholders to restrict stock and vehicle access to sensitive areas, weed control, targeted revegetation, and eco-hydrological assessment and restoration of the sites. The three-year project is funded until June 2023 by the Australian Government under the Regional Land Partnerships component of the National Landcare Program (phase 2).

Expressions of interest are being sought from individuals wishing to be considered for appointment as a member of the Steering Committee (SC). We are seeking to fill two volunteer SC member positions.

The role of volunteer SC members is to:

- Provide oversight for the project
- Provide technical advice to ensure effective implementation of the project and satisfaction of project outcomes
- Ensure thorough consideration of compliance requirements related to project delivery
- Engage in adaptive management of the project through ongoing project monitoring, evaluation and improvement, within the existing scope of the project design, in response to improved understanding of the impact and effectiveness of planned activities.

There are several management actions for this project that may be adaptively managed as the project progresses. SC members are expected to contribute to adjusting the project delivery design, within the existing scope of the project design. There four steering committee meetings each year in January, April, July, and October.

People with relevant knowledge or experience in one or more of the following are sought:

- Wetland restoration
- Project management experience in a similar field
- Project governance experience
- Stakeholder engagement, community liaison and education

Please note, a member may satisfy more than one of the desired membership criteria.

The SC will also include representatives from NRM South and the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment. Representatives of other project partners may attend SC meetings as observers.

Interested parties should send their C.V. and a cover letter outlining their suitability for appointments as a member of the SC. Please note that this is a volunteer position.
